Starting the Program

- Click on the “BibleWorks 6” icon on any workstation in the Research Center.
- When ready, close the first Welcome window.
- In the second Welcome window, select “Beginner Mode” if you are new to BibleWorks and want the program to coach you through a search.
- Select “Standard Mode” to work with this brochure. **For more information at any time, refer to the “Help” menu on the top toolbar or ask library staff.**
- Take a moment to study the toolbars. The top toolbar is standard to Windows. Drag your mouse along the second toolbar, pausing on each icon. A dialog box will appear, naming the function of the icon. Each of these is described in detail in the Help pages.

Searching

STEP 1: Click on the “Set Search Limits” button:



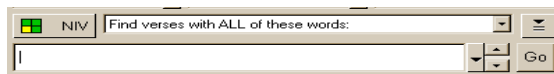
Select the books of the Bible which you want to search.

STEP 2: Click on the “Change Versions and Limits” button:



- Click on “Choose Search Version” and select one version which you wish to search.
- Click on “Choose Display Version(s)” and select versions to display.

STEP 3: In the Command Line (narrow rectangular box on the right) type the term(s) to be searched. In the drop-down menu above the Command Line, select the kind of search you wish to perform.



TIP: You may clear the previous search by pressing the ESC key.

Sample Searches

Scripture

Select “Display this verse” in the drop-down menu box. Type the text citation using the full name of the book or the 3-letter abbreviation from the back of this brochure. Ex:

Genesis 3:2 or 1pe 1

Single Word; Boolean AND

Select “Find verses with ALL of these words” in the drop-down box (or type a period)

phoebe
love hate

The second command searches for texts containing both words in any order.

Boolean OR

To look for verses containing either/any of 2 or more words, select “Find verses with ANY of these words” from the drop-down box (or type a slash):

jesus christ

TIP: Typing a period, slash or other punctuation mark at the *beginning* of a command will automatically select the correct command in the drop-down menu. The punctuation mark

will not be displayed in the Command Line.

Boolean NOT

To look for verses containing one word but not another, select “Find verses with ALL of these words” (or type a period) and precede the word to be excluded with an exclamation point:

christ !jesus

Exact Phrase

Select “Find verses with this string” in the drop-down box or type a single quotation mark:

god is love

Words Occurring within a Certain Number of Verses

Use a semicolon followed by the number:

paul barnabus;5

Compound Searches

Use parentheses:

(/Martha Mary) !(Martha Mary)

This combination searches for EITHER Mary OR Martha but not both.

Wild Cards

An asterisk represents zero or more characters; a question mark represents a single character. Ex:

*wom?n

will find “women,” “woman,”
“bondswoman,” etc.
